

Year One Home Learning Challenges! 08.06.20

Maths	<p>Each day can you start your maths practice by completing 1 slide of the Flashback PowerPoint? Can you complete one activity a day from White Rose Home Learning? https://whiterosemaths.com/homelearning/year-1/ Summer Term – Week 7: Counting in 2s, 5s and 10s. (There are also extra video links and activity sheets provided for anyone who has previously completed these activities) The website has now removed any free access to worksheets but you will find these and the correct video links in the attached files.</p> <p>There is a city with learn screens and activities linked to this week's maths.</p>
English / History	<p>Watch the story The Night Pirates. https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=mdWxBn-xvrQ What would you do on a pirate ship adventure? Where would you sail to? What would you take? What job would you do on the ship?</p> <p>History – Pirates sailed across the ocean in all different types of ships. Next week we are going to learn more about pirates. Look at the PowerPoint about Pirate Ships. Can you label the pirate ship and colour it in? You might like to describe the parts of the ship.</p> <p>SPaG This week we would like you to look at compound words. There is a learn screen where you can find out all about compound words on Education City. Then there is a game to play. There's some worksheets in the folder we have sent too. Don't worry if you cannot access Education city as we have included a PowerPoint too. If you would like to access Education City but require a password, please email Mrs Davies.</p>
Phonics	<p>Split digraphs are tricky and sometimes we forget that even though the letters are not together they work together to make one sound. Practise reading words containing split digraphs. Then read the comprehension sheet and see how many words you can find that contain a split digraph. There's also a few comprehension questions to answer.</p> <p>There's games to play at https://new.phonicsplay.co.uk/ Access is free whilst schools are closed. The username is march 20 and password is home. Also there's a phonics folder in the Classwork section of Education City.</p>
Geography	<p>Try and play the "Pirate Bunnies" game on BBC bitesize: https://www.bbc.co.uk/bitesize/topics/zvsd8xs/articles/z6vyf4j Choose the telescope coin to see how much you remember about the 4 countries that make up the United Kingdom. Choose the sailing coin to learn about the five oceans Choose the map coin to learn about the seven continents – do you recognise the flag that is revealed at the end? Choose the compass coin to practise your algorithm work and remind yourself of your compass points. You can also play the seasons and weather games. Write down, print or copy the flags that you discover and see if you can find them on a world map. Which oceans do they touch? Which oceans would you have to cross to get there from the UK? Have fun!</p>

Art / D&T	<p>Pirates sailed on lots of different ships. Some were tall and wide, with lots of room for storage, some were long and thin and travelled quickly through the oceans. Can you use some of the things in your house (plastic boxes, cardboard tubes, playdough...) to make your own pirate ship? Remember what you have learnt about materials...which ones will be waterproof? Will your ship have a name? Can you test your ship to see if it sails or....sinks??</p>

Spelling	<p>Choose 5 words each week from the Year 1 Common Exception Words. Each day spend 5 minutes practising how to spell them and also recognising what they look like so that you can read them without sounding out at all!</p>
Kindness	<p>Can you fill a bucket? Quite a while ago we looked at how we could fill a bucket by being kind to others. This week we would like you to think about what you have done that would fill your bucket. Can you write them on the bucket outline? Remember that helping someone, saying kind things and smiling are all bucket filling actions.</p>
Family Time	<p>This week our favourite family game has been dominoes. Have you tried this at home? If you don't have dominoes at home, there is an attachment to print some in the files. Enjoy x</p>
